

Prospects that race mixing will occur in Prince Edward County schools this fall appear dim despite a federal court ruling that the county must desegregate public schools by September.

There are two main reasons why race mixing probably won't occur this fall.

First, the County board of Supervisors can cut off school appropriations and go out of the school business. And the negro plaintiffs in the case must subject themselves to the state pupil placement act and its administrative remedies. (ROLL FILM)
