The ¹Governing Body voted six to one to continue the ~~Roanoke~~ Commodity Distribution Program. Councilman Vincent Wheeler voted against continuing the project. The vote came after Mayor Benton Dillard read a letter from Ellen Thompson of 509 Sixth Street, Southeast, the ~~mother~~ mother of nine children, asking that Council not discontinue the free food.

In other action during the relatively tranquil Council session, the Sewage Committee was directed to negotiate a new contract with customers out of the City Limits. The Committee reported that the price of treatment per million gallons of raw sewage to break even should be 79 dollars rather than the current 36 dollars. The Committee will return to Council with a report on negotiations.
